# Movement of farming products, including livestock, crops and machinery into Northern Ireland (NI) from Great Britain (GB) and Rest of World (RoW)

## **Livestock**

#### Action

- Ensure you have a valid <u>Import Licence</u> or <u>Sheep, Goats and Pigs for breeding and</u> <u>production</u> and <u>Laboratory animals for research</u>, applied for at least 10 working days in advance.
- Ensure you have a Veterinary Supplementary Support Certificate (VSSC) for movement of **Sheep, Goats and Pigs for breeding and production.**
- An Export Health Certificate (EHC) will be required for all live animals.
- Ensure that the **designated Port of Entry** is for live animals (**Belfast Port / Larne Port**).
- <u>Pre-Notification</u> of the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs (DAERA) through submission of a Common Health Entry Document (<u>CHED-A</u>) part 1 into <u>TRACES NT</u> a minimum of 24 hours prior to arrival.

#### **Important Information**

- Imports of live animals are controlled to prevent the import of disease into Northern Ireland and to protect the health of people and animals already in the province
- All Livestock movements are subject to 100% documentary, identity and physical checks with or without sampling as appropriate

# Movement of farming products, including livestock, crops and machinery into Northern Ireland from **Great Britain and Rest of World**

### <u>Crops – hay and straw and crop seeds for planting</u>

#### Action

#### Hay and straw

- - Importers should be familiar with the conditions attached to the General import Licence (note: there is no need to apply for a licence).
  - Pre-Notification of DAERA through submission of a CHED-P part 1 into TRACES NT a minimum of 24 hours prior to arrival.

#### **Crop seeds for planting**

- Importers should be aware of whether the seed needs to have an Orange International Seed Lot Certificate (OIC) for Marketing under the Organisation for Economic Co-Operation and Development (OECD) rules.
- Seeds for planting require a valid **Phytosanitary Certificate** prior to export.
- Pre-Notification of the DAERA through submission of a CHED-PP part 1 into TRACES NT a minimum of 24 hours prior to arrival.

#### **Important Information**

- Following the end of the European Union-United Kingdom (EU-UK) transition period on 31 December 2020 the rules permitting the movement of straw and hay from GB to NI changed.
- All seeds intended for planting must meet NI's import requirements.

## <u>Movement of Used Agricultural and Forestry Machinery (UAFM) from Great Britain to Northern Ireland</u> <u>Agricultural machinery</u>

#### Action

#### Moving UAFM from GB to NI under the Northern Ireland Plant Health Label (NIPHL) scheme:

There are two options available for the movement of Used Agricultural and Forestry Machinery (UAFM) from GB to NI:

The **NIPHL** scheme can be used where the **UAFM** is destined for NI. That is, it is intended for use by or sale to an end consumer in NI.

Details on moving **UAFM** under the simplified **NIPHL** Scheme arrangements can be found on the <u>NIPHL Used Agricultural and Forestry Machinery page</u>.

#### Moving UAFM from GB through NI to the EU/Ireland with a Phytosanitary Certificate:

Where UFAM has a destination in the EU/Ireland, and is just transiting NI, full <u>Official</u> <u>Controls Regulations (OCR)</u> rules apply, and a valid <u>Phytosanitary Certificate</u> is required.

Where UAFM is moved to NI for onward sale to EU/Ireland, full <u>OCR</u> rules apply, and a valid <u>Phytosanitary Certificate</u> is required.

<u>Pre-Notification</u> of DAERA through submission of a <u>CHED-PP</u> part 1 into <u>TRACES NT</u> a minimum of 24 hours prior to arrival.
