

Movement of fish and fishery products into Northern Ireland (NI) from Great Britain (GB) and Rest of World (RoW)

Action

- You must first receive an [Export Health Certificate \(EHC\)](#) and supporting documentation such as a valid [Catch Certificate the Fish Export Service \(FES\)](#) associated with the consignment from your Great Britain (GB) supplier
- You must [pre-notify](#) the Northern Ireland Port of Entry.
- Pre-notification must be done online through [TRACES-NT](#) a **minimum of 24 hours prior to arrival**
- You must complete **Part 1** of the [Common Health Entry Document \(CHED\)](#) on [TRACES-NT](#). A [CHED-A](#) is used for live animals and [CHED-P](#) is used for products of animal origin containing fish for human consumption
- Ensure that all regulated fish and fishery products enter NI through a [designated Port of Entry](#) (**Belfast Port/ Larne Port**)

Important Information

The Northern Ireland consignee (person responsible for the consignment in NI), must follow the steps in order to successfully move live fish / ornamental fish / live shellfish / trout egg and products of animal origin containing fish for human consumption from GB to NI or Rest of the World (RoW) to NI via GB.

What is a Catch Certificate?

A Catch Certificate provides information, which proves that the fishery product/s have been caught under a legal fishing regime.

A validated Catch Certificate (CC) needs to be created on the Fish Export Service (FES).
