### New Windsor Framework guidance

To further support your readiness for the new Windsor Framework arrangements by 31 March 2025, TSS have recently added documents to the Northern Ireland Customs and Trade Academy (NICTA) website.

### Trader Goods Profile recap

#### What is the Trader Goods Profile and how do I use it?

TGP supports the new arrangements being introduced for moving goods from Great Britain (GB) to Northern Ireland (NI) as part of the Windsor Framework. You should be fully prepared by 31 March 2025 for these new arrangements. TGP is an online service available to UK Internal Market Scheme (UKIMS) authorised traders that can be used to store information about goods you commonly move from GB to NI.

Every UKIMS authorised trader has their own TGP, and should you choose to use it, once it's set up you'll save time when the new arrangements come into effect. This is because your TGP can be used to complete certain Internal Market Movement Information (IMMI) data fields. Each record in your TGP will contain a goods description, commodity code, product reference, country of origin, category of goods and supplementary units if required. The data fields are listed in our <u>Checklist for Traders</u> and <u>Checklist for Hauliers</u>.

You will only have to add movement-specific information such as volume, mass and value to the IMMI. The information in your TGP can be used to auto-populate the IMMI providing you set it up and give TSS permission to access it.

The IMMI is a reduced data set which can be used instead of a full declaration for 'not at risk' goods you move from GB to NI as part of the simplified processes for Internal Market Movements.

# Trader Goods Profile public beta: access your Trader Goods Profile via HMRC and the TSS

#### What is the HMRC TGP public beta?

On 22 January, HMRC contacted TSS users to launch a public beta for the Trader Goods Profile (TGP).

The TGP public beta gives UKIMS authorisation holders an opportunity to access their TGP and ensure it contains accurate data about the goods they move from GB to NI. This will allow Traders to use their TGP as soon as the new arrangements come into effect.

When you're using the TGP public beta, you'll have access to <u>comprehensive guidance</u> and be able to provide feedback directly on GOV.UK to inform development of the service.

#### How do I access the HMRC TGP public beta?

The TGP public beta can be accessed now on <u>GOV.UK</u>.

- You'll need to log in with your Government Gateway account using the EORI number associated with your UKIMS authorisation.
- If necessary, you'll be asked to register your EORI number with the <u>Customs Declaration</u> <u>Service (CDS)</u>.
- Have your <u>Northern Ireland Retail Movement Scheme (NIRMS)</u> number and <u>Northern</u> <u>Ireland Plant Health Label (NIPHL)</u> authorisation number to hand, if you move goods that require these.

If you were UKIMS authorised on or before 19 June 2024, HMRC has pre-populated your TGP with goods moved from GB to NI in the 12 months up to this date.

Since the Trader Goods Profile is a live service hosted by HMRC, any updates you make on GOV.UK will be reflected on the TSS Portal, and vice versa, including the pre-populated data for goods moved on or before 19 June 2024.

#### How do I access the TGP on the TSS Portal?

As the Trader Goods Profile hosted by HMRC is now available to UKIMS authorisation holders, after the TSS Portal updates have taken place on Sunday 2 February you will be able to access your TGP through the TSS Portal as well as via GOV.UK.

Provided you have completed the access and permissions on your TSS Company Profile, you will be able to access your TGP on the TSS Portal, and, when available, use it to populate data onto your Internal Market Movements when you submit an IMMI.

Additionally, the TSS Portal will allow you to grant access to a third party (e.g. a haulier, intermediary, or agent) to manage your TGP on your behalf.

# Get ready to access your Trader Goods Profile: is your business subscribed to the Customs Declaration Service?

We advised you in TSS Bulletin 184 that to sign up to access and use your Trader Goods Profile your business will need to be subscribed to the Customs Declaration Service, also referred to as CDS. <u>You can read the full article here</u>.

If your business is not already subscribed to the CDS, you will need to subscribe before you can gain access to your Trader Goods Profile, and you can do this now on <u>GOV.UK</u>.

#### New Windsor Framework TSS Portal feature: are you 'IMMI Ready'?

From 2 February 2025, you will be able to view your company dashboard on your TSS Company profile and check if it is 'IMMI Ready'

TSS have summarised all of the Windsor Framework processes you can add and set up on your TSS Company Profile in order to help you make use of the simplified processes for Internal Market Movements.

To see the dashboard, pictured above, which will be visible for all users on the TSS account, the Primary account holder will need to answer 'Yes' to the question 'Are you planning on using the Windsor Framework features?' at the top of your TSS Company Profile.

- This question refers to using the Windsor Framework simplified processes to submit Internal Market Movement Information (IMMI) for your 'not at risk' goods movement from GB to NI.
- If you select 'Yes' the dashboard will then be visible and TSS will review your profile and identify actions you can take to ensure you are 'IMMI Ready'. As each action is completed, the dashboard will update to reflect the changes you make to your profile.
- If you are not planning on using the Windsor Framework simplified processes you can select 'No' so that TSS know your choice and movement preference.

#### Step 1: Upload your UKIMS authorisation

**Why?** Your UKIMS authorisation gives you access to submit an IMMI on the TSS Portal and access to your Trader Goods Profile (TGP). Without your UKIMS authorisation added to your profile you won't be able to benefit from the Windsor Framework simplified processes on the TSS, nor make 'not at risk' movements on the TSS Portal using your authorisation.

#### Step 2: Upload your NIRMS authorisation

**Why?** If you move goods via the Northern Ireland Retail Movement Scheme (NIRMS), uploading your scheme number to your TSS Company Profile allows the TSS to support the correct categorisation of your goods on your TGP and on the IMMI. Eligible goods can be

moved as Standard Goods instead of Category 2 goods, but only if the NIRMS information is stored on your TSS Company Profile.

#### Step 3: Authorise TSS to access your Trader Goods Profile

**Why?** If you are using your Trader Goods Profile to populate data into your IMMI, you will need to authorise TSS to access your TGP data from HMRC, as TGP is hosted by GOV.UK.

#### Step 4: Define your permissions for UKIMS and Trader Goods Profile

**Why?** If you will engage with a haulier or intermediary to submit the IMMI on your behalf, you will need to set them up with the appropriate permissions to use your UKIMS authorisation and your TGP, if you are using one, to submit the IMMI data on the TSS Portal. You can also give permission to a TSS third-party account to manage and maintain your TGP Data.

Although you can give permission to a third-party TSS user to submit IMMI data or manage your TGP on your behalf, you as the UKIMS authorisation holder are responsible for the accuracy of the information submitted on the IMMI.

#### Post-webinar Q&A

#### Q: What is a 'Trader Reference' / 'Product Reference' in the Trader Goods Profile?

A: The 'Trader Reference' / 'Product Reference' is a custom name or number that you can give to a goods record to help identify it in your TGP and use it to populate the data onto the Internal Market Movement Information (IMMI). Each goods record must have its own unique reference so it can be distinguished. You may choose to use the goods Stock Keeping Unit (SKU) for this field, for example.

#### Q Can my haulier or agent use my Trader Goods Profile?

A: Yes, if you are not completing the IMMI and instead are using a haulier or intermediary to complete the IMMI on your behalf, TSS allows you to give access and permissions to other TSS users to use your UKIMS authorisation and your TGP to complete an IMMI. You will still need to provide information to your haulier or agent, such as confirming the EORI for your UKIMS authorisation, confirming the goods moving are 'not at risk' and eligible for the simplified processes, as well as providing the trader reference or goods description and other goods information to successfully submit the IMMI.

# UK imports: reminder of the new Safety and Security requirements for Entry Summary Declarations from 31 January 2025

In <u>TSS Bulletin 185</u> we published a reminder that the new Safety and Security requirement for Entry Summary Declarations for imports into GB are due from 31 January 2025.

There is no requirement for a safety and security declaration for <u>qualifying Northern Ireland</u> <u>Goods</u> which will continue to benefit from unfettered access arrangements. This means the vast majority of goods moving from Northern Ireland to Great Britain will not require Entry Summary Declarations, but you are encouraged to check if your movement will require one.
