

# Assisted Completion Service Quick Guide

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## Using the Assisted Completion Service for support with submitting a Supplementary Declaration

#### **Assisted Completion Service**

With the Assisted Completion Service<sup>1</sup>, a Trader Support Service (TSS) agent will complete up to five Supplementary Declarations a month on your behalf for goods movements from Great Britain (GB) to Northern Ireland (NI). This includes all data submission on the TSS Portal and help with resolution of any errors.

#### Information required for the Assisted Completion agent to submit a Supplementary Declaration on your behalf

Information can usually be sourced from Commercial Invoice and Packing List. The next page provides additional guidance on finding this information.

Information type	Likely information source	Information required <sup>1</sup>	Additional guidance
Trader information	TSS platform and internal Trader accounts	Importer name, TSS account number, UKIMS number (if registered) and customs duty waiver eligibility	Information may be pulled from your company profile on TSS.
Movement information	TSS platform and Commercial Invoice	Arrival date, LRN Number (SUP Number), Transport Document Number, SFD Reference	You can find the Arrival date, SFD Declaration Reference and Transport Document Number in the Previous Movement Information section. You can find your LRN at the top of your Supplementary Declaration.
Goods	Commercial Invoice and	5 Commodity Code	See NICTA guidance on How to Identify your Commodity Code.
information	the Packing List	6 Origin	Country where the goods were wholly obtained and can be found on the Packing List.
		<b>7</b> Description of goods	A detailed <u>description</u> of the goods that were moved.
		8 Gross Mass (kg)	May be on the product itself, the Packing List or Commercial Invoice.
		9 Net Mass (kg)	May be on the product itself, the Packing List or Commercial Invoice.
		10 Supplementary Units	Consult the trade tariff for these units, they are used when a commodity code requires an additional measurement unit: <u>https://www.trade-tariff.service.gov.uk/xi/sections</u> .
		11 Item price/value	Can be found on Commercial Invoice.
		12 Currency	Can be found on Commercial Invoice.
		13 No. of pkgs	This information can usually be found on the Packing List.
		14 Type of pkgs	This information can usually be found on the Packing List.
		15 Invoice Number	This is located on the Suppliers Commercial Invoice.
		16 Are goods to be released into free circulation?	This just means that the goods are customs cleared in Northern Ireland. It does not matter if they are intended to be sold on anywhere else.
		17 INCOTERM	Incoterms are often stated on the Commercial Invoice, or contract of sale between the buyer and seller. You could also contact the supplier or haulier to find this. More details shown here: <u>Incoterms Explained</u> .
		18 Delivery Location Town	Location where responsibility for transporting or loss of goods between buyer and seller changes, usually importer address.
		19 Freight Charges	Only required for certain incoterms, these are the costs of transporting the goods.
